RESOLUTION NO. 1998-6

A RESOLUTION of the City Council of the City of Lakewood, Washington, requesting Governor Locke and the Washington State Legislature to restore full funding of the sales tax equalization account for cities and towns

WHEREAS, in 1982, the Washington State Legislature created the Sales Tax Equalization Account to provide Cities and Towns that receive considerably less than the statewide average in sales tax revenues with a proportionate share of Washington State sales tax equalization revenue; and,

WHEREAS, after many years where the sales tax equalization was sufficient to fully fund the first three distributions with some money left for the fourth distribution, the State is not currently funding Sales Tax Equalization at the statutorily established level; and,

WHEREAS, incorporations of new cities and annexations which have been encouraged and promoted by the Washington Growth Management Act adopted by the State Legislature in 1990, have dramatically decreased the revenues available to each city, old and new alike, resulting in significantly less revenue available to their general funds; and

WHEREAS, said reductions of revenues have curtailed projects and services, thereby reducing the quality of life for our citizens,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES as follows:
