RESOLUTION NO. 2000-12

A RESOLUTION of the City Council of the City of Lakewood, Washington, authorizing application for funding assistance for an outdoor recreation project to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation as provided by the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program - for the Wards Lake Development and Expansion Project, the Kiwanis Park Upgrade Project and the Flett Creek Property Acquisition Project

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lakewood has developed a "Comprehensive Parks Master Plan" which identifies park facility needs in the City; and,

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Washington Wildlife Recreation Program, state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and habitat conservation areas and the construction and improvement of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies, through the Washington State Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation (IAC); and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Lakewood considers it in the best public interest to develop park facilities, including developing and improving facilities at the proposed Wards Lake Park, upgrading facilities at the Kiwanis Park, and the Flett Creek Property Acquisition Project, and to apply for such funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAKEWOOD, WASHINGTON HEREBY RESOLVES as follows:

1. The City Manager is authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance to support and be utilized for the following proposed projects:

A. The Wards Lake Development and Expansion Project

B. The Kiwanis Park Upgrade Project

C. The Flett Creek Property Acquisition Project

2. The City's matching share of the project funding will be subsidized through agreements with Clover Park Technical College's partnership in developing Wards Lake Park, and through the Clover Park Kiwanis Club's adoption of Kiwanis Park.

3. Any facilities developed with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation will be placed in uses as outdoor recreation facilities and will be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.

4. This Resolution shall be part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

5. Adequate notification has been given and the opportunity provided for public input and that published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.

6. The site plans involved have been, or will, prior to acquisition and/or development, be, adopted and approved by the City Council.

7. The City of Lakewood acknowledges that it must support all non-cash commitments to the local share should they not materialize from their anticipated sources.

8. The City of Lakewood certifies that it is, or will become at acquisition and/or before development, the owner of the land to be acquired and/or developed, and based on current knowledge, provides assurance there are no encumbrances, and/or that at acquisition and/or before development there will be no encumbrances, on the land to be acquired and/or developed which would restrict the recreation or habitat conservation used of the land as proposed in this application.

9. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon passage and signatures hereon.
